Helmet Policy: ASTM/SEI or BSI approved helmets are required for all riders at all times while mounted on Five Fires Equestrian Center property.

Entry Requirements: Both riders and horse owners must have a NSEF membership or equivalent Provincial Sport Organization (PSO) membership. Riders may enter with only a PSO membership. (Equestrian Canada sport license not required.)

Competition Office

The Show Office will be open from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Friday, July 6 and 8:00 am to 3:30 pm Saturday, July 7 and Sunday, July 8. The show office is located at the front of the Five Fires arena. Please register at the office upon arrival.

Refunds and Substitutions

- Competitors withdrawing an entry after the official closing date but earlier than 48 hours prior to the commencement of competition will be refunded entry fees minus an administration fee of \$35, upon the receipt of a vet certificate of disability or a doctor's certificate. Competitors withdrawing later than 48 hours prior to the commencement of competition will forfeit all fees.
- Another horse may be substituted up until July 5 for a horse unable to compete, if it is competing in the same classes.

Deadline:

- Entries must be received in hand by Saturday, July 28, 2018.
- Ride times will be sent out and posted by 6:00 pm, Thursday, August 2, 2018.

Ring Size:

- Para-equestrian tests will be ridden in an indoor 20m X 40m sand ring if required.
- All other tests will be ridden in an indoor 20m x 60m sand ring.

Tests:

- Walk Trot through Level Four are Equine Canada tests.
- Western Dressage tests are Western Style Dressage Association of Canada tests.
- Please see 'Class Lists and Tests' on page five for a link to all tests.

Bridle Numbers:

It is compulsory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse anywhere outside the stall from the time that the number is issued at arrival until the end of the competition. Bridle numbers are issued at time of arrival.

Stabling Information:

- 1. Stalls are available on site.
- 2. Stalls are 10' X 10'.
- 3. Please provide your own bedding, hay and feed, and all necessary horse keeping tools and equipment.
- 4. Please groom and tack horses inside the stalls.

- 5. Stall fees cover from 4:00 pm Friday to 4:00 pm Saturday, or from 4:00 pm Saturday to 4:00 pm Sunday, or any part there of. For example arriving Saturday morning and taking a stall until Sunday is two stall days.
- 6. <u>Stalls must be cleaned</u> prior to departure from the facility in order for the stall deposit to be refunded.
- 7. Please observe disease prevention procedures posted on site (<u>bio-security plan</u>), for example:
 - Hand washing
 - Cleansing tubs and buckets
 - Physical separation of horses

Placing, Ribbons and Prizes

- 1. Class ribbons will be awarded to sixth place.
- 2. Ties: In the event that riders have the same total points, the rider with the highest collective marks is the winner. When collective marks are tied the horses shall remain tied.
- 3. Where there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes will be awarded in accordance with the following chart:

AAA

 $2^{nd} - 57\%$ to 59.9% $3^{rd} - 54\%$ to 56.9% $4^{th} - 51\%$ to 53.9%

In this instance no ribbons or prizes will be awarded below 4th place

- 4. A championship and reserve championship will be awarded for **each competition**. The champion and reserve champion will be determined by adding each rider's top two scores with the same horse. In the event of a tie the rider with the highest single score will be the champion. The high point champion will receive a night at the <u>Truro Super 8</u>.
- 5. The reserve high point champion will receive a Greenhawk Truro saddle pad.
- A Five Fires Fifth Anniversary High Point Championship trophy and Reserve High Point Championship trophy will be awarded at the end of the August 4 & 5, 2018 competition.

There will also be a walk trot, training level, first level and second level series champion awarded at the August 4 & 5 competition.

Riders must compete in both of the series competitions (July 7 & 8, August 4 & 5) to be eligible for the Series Championships.

The series champions (over all and by level) will be determined by adding eligible riders' top two scores from the same level, same horse, for the July 7 & 8, and August 4 & 5 shows – a total of four scores.

There is also a Halloween show with freestyle costume classes on October 20 & 21. This isn't part of the championship series.

- Series shows are qualifiers for the <u>Atlantic Canada Equestrian</u> <u>Championship (ACE)</u>.

Restaurants and Accommodations

- A variety of restaurants are available in Brookfield, 5 minutes from the competition facility.
- The closest hotel is <u>Super 8</u>, 7 minutes away. Super 8 offers a 15% discount to Five Fires customers and features a swimming pool, water slide, hot tub and included breakfast. There is a Cineplex across the street. Ask for the Five Fires discount to receive 15% off of the regular price.

Warm Up

- An outdoor, sand warm up ring is provided.
- Lunging is permitted if it doesn't interfere with riders. If lunging please be
 respectful of others' needs and lunge at non-peak times, and when riders aren't
 present. Competition Management may request that lunging be discontinued,
 based on warm up ring usage and their own discretion.

General Rules and Information

- 1. Scotia Series <u>rules</u> are in effect for all classes / tests except Western Dressage.
- 2. Western Style Dressage Association of Canada <u>rules</u> are in effect for Western Dressage tests.
- 3. Side reins, draw reins and martingales aren't permitted.
- 4. Dogs must be on a leash at all times.
- 5. Competitors may use a reader for any test, and are responsible for finding their own reader.
- 6. Competition Management reserves the right to make rulings upon any matters not covered by the prize list specifications.
- 7. Space permitting, horses are permitted to attend without competing. Administration and stabling fees apply. Please fill out entry form and include all fees. Bridle numbers must be worn at all times outside of stall. Non-competing horses may use warm up areas if space in the warm up area permits, at the discretion of Competition Management.
- 8. Please groom and tack horses inside the stalls.
- 9. Stall fees cover from 4:00 pm Friday to 4:00 pm Saturday, or from 4:00 pm Saturday to 4:00 pm Sunday, or any part there of. For example arriving Saturday morning and taking a stall until Sunday is two stall days.
- 10. <u>Stalls must be cleaned</u> prior to departure from the facility in order for the stall deposit to be refunded.
- 11. Please observe disease prevention procedures posted on site (<u>bio-security plan</u>), for example:
 - Hand washing
 - Cleansing tubs and buckets
