Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles:

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Concussion Awareness

Equestrian Canada Concussion Protocols- Equestrian Canada (EC) is one of the first national governing bodies for sport in Canada to implement official, sport-specific guidelines on return-to-play protocols for athlete concussions.

EC's Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule

EC's concussion-related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1, 2018 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101.

General Competitions Rules & Regulations

- PHOTOGRAPHS OF EXHIBITOR(S) AND/OR EXHIBITS: Each exhibitor shall agree that
 photographs taken of the exhibitor and/or exhibits by any photographer approved by
 Sambea Farm may be used for purposes of promotion by Sambea Farm or its official
 sponsors.
- The Sambea National Horse Competition is sanctioned as a Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC." (A602.1)
- "Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book." (A602.2)
- "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location." (A602.6)
- "Per Article A80: 1, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition." (A602.7)
- Applicable EC Rule Book references are sometimes noted but are not a substitute for knowledge of the Rule Book itself
- The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. The Person Responsible is required to be on the competition grounds.
- Electronic Devices: Texting while mounted is not allowed anywhere on the competition grounds. No cell phone shall be stuck/wedged under a rider's helmet.

1. Memberships:

- a. All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold Sport License (A205); OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or License Transfer (A212) for a Sliver or Bronze Sport License to Gold License; OR purchase a Temporary Sport License (A208 not eligible for points)
- b. Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) membership.



- c. All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation, and foreign entries must sign an affidavit
- d. All athletes competing in Amateur classes must posses a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request (A902)
- e. Exception: Lead line riders who require only a NSEF or other PTSO membership
- f. Please be aware that NSHJA membership is required to participate and/or benefit in the NSHJA Programs.

2. EC Horse Recordings/EC National Passports/FEI Passports

- a. All Canadian entries are required to have an EC Horse Recording with a valid EC horse license to compete (A402), or if owned by a temporary sport license holder a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (A404)
- b. Exception: Lead line riders, and horses or ponies competing in <u>only</u> the hack division.

3. Equestrian Canada and Discipline Fees

Equine Medication Control - Drug Testing and Fees:

- a. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.6) (A1008)
- b. The person responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse (A101). The person responsible may be the trainer or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The person responsible must be an adult and must have an EC individual or group license, with the exception of a Junior Exhibitor parent or guardian. (A214)

Jump Canada Levy Fee:

a. All EC-sanctioned competitions are required to collect a Jump Canada Levy of \$20.00 per entry.

4. Entries:

- a. Entries must be received in hand by the closing date. Any entry not received by closing date will be considered Late Entry and subject to an additional \$40 Late Entry administration fee. Post Entry Fee: \$50.
- Entries will be accepted by email but will NOT be processed until e-transfer completed.
- c. Entries will be accepted through Horse Shows Online (May 21st-29th only). Credit cards can only be accepted with Horse Shows Online entry.
- d. One horse per entry form.



- e. All entries must be completed on a Sambea entry form. All entries must be complete with proper signatures, complete address, membership and passport numbers. No phone or Facebook entries can be accepted.
- f. The Competition Management has the right to refuse or limit entries as circumstances warrant.
- g. No "hors concours" at this competition: Article A808.

5. Cancellations & Substitution of Entry:

- a. If cancellations are received in writing by 12pm (noon) on Thursday June 7, with a copy of a Doctor of Veterinary Certificate or Medical Doctor's Certificate, all fees will be refunded less the \$40 Administration Fee plus 15% HST. After this date there will be no refunds.
- b. Substitution of Entries: Will be at the discretion of the competition manager & competition secretary.

6. Adds/Scratches:

- a. At the discretion of the Competition Office.
- b. An add fee of \$10 per class and/or per division may apply to adds on the day of the class. Added entries may be required to go first in the order of go, if applicable.
- c. All scratches must be recorded in the competition office.
- d. Entries that have not scratched according to the above procedures is fully liable for all fees (See A816) and \$10 penalty applies.
- e. Horses competing in a class without being officially entered will pay the class fee and may be subject to a \$10 penalty.

7. Payment:

- a. All entry fees, medication fees, Jump Canada Levy and administration fees and stabling fees (if applicable) must be paid in full prior to the competition.
- b.\$40 Administration Fee will apply.
- c. Payment can be made by cash, cheque or electronic fund transfer
- d. Cheques are to be made payable to Sambea Farm. No post-dated cheques.
- e. Please note there is a \$10 processing fee if paying by credit card via Horse Shows Online. There is not a credit/debit terminal on show grounds.
- f. Sambea Farm is a registered business, and as such must collect HST on any competition fees not passed on to a second party, i.e. Equestrian Canada (HST #803603935 RT0001)

 - Wednesday May 30 Thursday June 7: Entries will be subject to a \$20.00 late fee.
 - June 8-9-10: Day of competition: entries will be subject to a \$40.00 post entry fee.
 - Nomination Fees apply to the jumper decision.



8. Returned Cheques:

- a. A \$50 charge will be assessed on all returned cheques.
- b. Unsettled accounts will be referred to EC, which will result in suspension from all EC competitions.
- c. Accounts left unpaid will not be permitted to compete at future Sambea National or Summer Horse competitions until paid in full.

9. Schedule:

- a. The Competition Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any class or division with insufficient entries. Any class/division with fewer than 5 entries may be combined or cancelled or run with no prize money offered.
- b. Orders of Go: Sign up orders of go will be offered. However, if competitors, trainers or support staff are not respectful of the time, competition management will create posted orders of go.
- c. Schedule times may result in an earlier start time based on the number of entries.
- d. The tentative schedule will be published on the Sambea Farm Facebook page in advance of the first day of competition. Any changes to the schedule will be posted there as well.

10. Protective Headgear:

- a. See A905 and G102. At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear.
- b. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM
 (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.);
 BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards; or AS/NZS
 (Australian/New Zealand Standards.
- c. Protective headgear must be properly fitted and securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.

11. Competition Numbers & Dress Code:

- a. Sambea issued competition numbers must be worn and visible at all time in the schooling and warm-up areas and in the competition ring (A814). Any horse wearing the incorrect number may be eliminated.
- b. Dress Code: Competition management may monitor ring attire. Refer to G109.

12. Office Hours:

a. The competition office will open 60 minutes before the start of the competition day and will close 30 minutes after the last class of the day.

13. Stabling

- a. Limited stabling (20 stalls available on-site Wednesday-Sunday). First come basis.
- b. \$40 per day/night, HST applicable
- c. Bring your own bedding or reserve peat moss \$8/bale plus HST
- d. Stalls MUST be prepaid to secure reservation. Please use stable form.
- e. Several local barns in the arena may have stabling available.



14. Pony Measurement:

- a. Pony measurements will be done before the first pony class. Location will be announced. Posting will be in competition office.
- b. Ponies under 8 years of age must be measured annually and will be issued a temporary measurement form (G111-A1104)
- c. Horses may be measured randomly.

15. Presentations:

- a. Hunter competitors must return to the ring for jog and presentation dressed appropriately and with horses in a bridle when required.
- b. Jumper competitors must be mounted when entering the ring for presentations.
- c. Class Winners, Champions & Reserve Champions will have their photos taken in ring

16. Schooling & Schooling Rules

- a. FEI Schooling rules will apply.
- b. In the Hunter Divisions an Open Schooling Card is offered. Cost is \$25. Please indicate on the entry form.
- c. A horse/rider combination is allowed one schooling round. This schooling round applies to the first O/F course entered of the day.
- d. No placings or ribbons.
- e. For Jumper Divisions, no schooling rounds are offered. Horses may flat in the competition arena if time allows.

17. Competition Arena Rental

- a. Available by the half/hour Thursday with practice fences at \$40 per half/hour, 1-4 horses.
- b. Email sambeafarm@gmail.com in advance to make arrangements.

18. General Information

- a. Trucks and trailers must be parked in designated parking areas.
- b. Fire lanes must remain clear.
- c. Car parking is 200m from Sambea competition grounds at the Lawrencetown Community Center
- d. Trailer entrance to Sambea is just past Conrad Road off the Hwy 207.
- e. Canteen services will be available.



19. Premiums & Payouts

- a. Prize money will be mailed to owners, within 10 business days following the competition after verification that all entry and applicable fees have been paid. However, every effort will be made to payout prize money at the end of the competition.
- b. Prize money may be credited to accounts.

20. Prizes: Hunter Divisions

- a. Ribbons to 6th place in all classes
- b. Prize money: is awarded to 4th place in EC Rated Divisions: 1st \$30 2nd \$25 3rd \$20 4th \$15

- d. Prize Money: Hunter Derby: 1st \$100, 2nd \$90, 3rd \$80, 4th \$70, 5th \$60, 6th \$50 7th \$25 8th \$25
- e. Prize Money: 2'6 Hunter Stake: 1st \$70 2nd \$60 3rd \$50 4th \$40 5th \$30 6th \$20 7th \$15 \$8th \$15

**Short/Long Stirrup Hunter Division:

Ribbons Only. This division is intended as an introduction to horse showing for riders not ready for the regular pony and hunter divisions.

Short Stirrup: Open to Junior "C" riders. Riders are classified as Junior "C" until the end of the calendar year in which they turn twelve. Short Stirrup Riders in this division may only cross enter into the Walk Trot Canter and or "C" equitation on the flat classes. Riders may show in non-rated classes that jumps do not to exceed 2'3. Riders must enter and complete at least one over fences class in the division to be eligible to compete in the Under-Saddle class. Ponies or horses may enter. Suitability is a factor. Horses or ponies may show in other classes with a different rider. This division will jump a course of hunter style jumps not to exceed two feet (2'). Distances will not be adjusted from horses to ponies. Entries will not be required to jog. EC membership is required.

As entries warrant, Children's and Adults may be combined. Jogging for soundness is at the discretion of Show Management. EC Membership is required.

Divisional Entry Fee: \$50

This division is intended for riders who are learning how to show a hunter and are not yet ready for regular hunter divisions. There is no time limit for showing in these divisions. Open to all Children's and Adult Amateur rider designations as per EC rules, guidelines, and limitations. Courses will be made up of hunter style jumps and set at a height not to exceed 2.6". Classes will be run per EC rules, guidelines, and limitations. Riders may NOT cross enter at the same show into any Hunter Division with heights more than 2'9" or any Jumper classes with heights more than 1.0m. Riders may compete in equitation classes where the height does not exceed 3'. Showing in this division will affect a horse's eligibility. As entries warrant, Children's and Adults may be combined. Jogging for soundness is at the discretion of Show Management. EC Membership is required.

Hunter Derby Guidelines

Please note: The Canadian Hunter Derby (CHD) series offers classes to qualify for the Final at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair. The following specifications are guidelines for derby classes being offered outside of the CHD Series.

Sambea Hunter Derby Rated for EC Awards 2018

- 1. A Hunter Derby is a high-performance class that is a combination of a hunter classic and a handy hunter class. The course must be a combination of natural obstacles post and rail, pen, ditch, etc., and handy elements trot jump, rollbacks, unique approaches, option jumps, etc. As per G402.3, the horse must be able to knock down the top element of hunter fences. Derbies may consist of one or two rounds. The height of the option jumps must be listed in the class specifications in the competition prize list.
- 2. A Hunter Derby will be judged on performance, pace, style, handiness, and brilliance. Bonus scores and handy performance scores may be awarded and must be published with the class specifications in the competition prize list. If a specific score is awarded for a bonus option, the score must be given regardless of refusal, knockdown, or poor jumping style, provided the fence (or option) is taken.
- 3. Open numerical scoring is required. The base score is announced first, then the bonus scores, then the total score. The next horse in the order should not begin its round until the scores for the previous horse are announced. Suggestion for bonus scores: High and/or handy options may be awarded bonus scores in addition to the base score. Two points per high option (at least five high options with a maximum of 10) for a maximum of 20 bonus points. "Handy" option bonus to a maximum of 10 points. A total of 30 points could be added to the base hunter score.
- 4. Derbies will count toward provincial awards. In mixed Derbies, points shall be counted in their respective divisions (see Article G204.8). <u>Derbies in which juniors, amateurs, and professionals are</u> combined do not count for points. Derbies must be jogged to count for provincial points.
- 5. A Derby may be offered at EC-recognized competitions to horses and/or ponies. Should ponies compete in a Derby for horses, no distance adjustments will be made.
- 6. A Hunter Derby will not be split regardless of the number of entries.

<u>J.A. Anderson Legacy Medal:</u> To participate in this Medal series, riders must register in advance of the competitions in order for points to count. This Medal registration is done through the NSEF and NOT at competition offices.

The J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal is a **skills-based** jumper medal series with the intent to identify athletes who have the potential to become Canada's next high-performance athletes.

Technical

The format of the J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal will be consistent across the country and may be held at any sanctioned competition that offers the height of <u>1.20m</u> for competitors. This class is designed as a jumper equitation class, to be held in the main jumper ring, at the 1.20m - 1.25m level with spreads to a maximum of 1.30m. The class will run as a Table A with two rounds, the second round, being a jump-off style round under Equestrian Canada (EC) rules. There will be a time allowed and time faults



- reflected in the judge's overall score as subtracting one (1) point for each second over the time allowed. Each rail will incur four (4) points taken off the overall score. Two refusals will be cause for elimination.
- The course may have natural fences, a Liverpool, or a small water jump at the course designer's discretion. No work off is required but it remains at the judge's discretion. Start and finish markers must be provided, and an audible tone will be used.
- Stallions are allowed per EC jumper division rules. A jumper type horse with jumper equipment is allowed and will not be penalized.

Eligibility

- The class will be open to current Provincial/Territorial Sport Organization (PTSO) and EC member riders age 25 and under as of December 31 of each year. Athletes shall declare their intent to compete in the J.C. Anderson Legacy
- Medal class to their respective PTSO by their first qualifying competition. A \$25.00 fee
 per horse/athlete combination must accompany the declaration. PTSO's will manage
 respective athlete declarations.
- Any athlete meeting the qualifications may participate in any number of PTSO level J.C Anderson Legacy Medal classes. Athletes wishing to compete in the Regional Finals (see below) must have competed in at least two PTSO level designated J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal classes (at any competition) between January 1st, 2018 and August 19, 2018. The top ten athletes from the Eastern Regional Final (ERF) and the top ten athletes from the Western Regional Final (WRF) will be eligible and encouraged to compete at the National J.C. Anderson Legacy Medal Final. If one region does not send 10 competitors, the other region may make up the number for a maximum total of 20 final competitors.
