Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles:

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- •Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane. (A602.3(f))

Concussion Awareness

Equestrian Canada Concussion Protocols- Equestrian Canada (EC) is one of the first national governing bodies for sport in Canada to implement official, sport-specific guidelines on return-to-play protocols for athlete concussions.

EC's Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule

EC's concussion-related Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1, 2018 for all EC sanctioned competitions in Canada. The full rule can be found in the <u>EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 101</u>.

General Competitions Rules & Regulations

- PHOTOGRAPHS OF EXHIBITOR(S) AND/OR EXHIBITS: Each exhibitor shall agree that
 photographs taken of the exhibitor and/or exhibits by any photographer approved by
 Sambea Farm may be used for purposes of promotion by Sambea Farm or its official
 sponsors.
- The Sambea National Horse Competition is sanctioned as a Gold and Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC." (A602.1)
- "Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book." (A602.2)
- "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location." (A602.6)
- "Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition." (A602.7)
- Applicable EC Rule Book references are sometimes noted but are not a substitute for knowledge of the Rule Book itself
- The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. The Person Responsible is required to be on the competition grounds.
- Electronic Devices: Texting while mounted is not allowed anywhere on the competition grounds. No cell phone shall be stuck/wedged under a rider's helmet.

1. Memberships:

- All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold or Bronze Sport License (A205)-(A207); OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or License Transfer (A212) for a Sliver or Bronze Sport License to Gold License; OR purchase a Temporary Sport License (A208 – not eligible for points)
- Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) membership.



- All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation, and foreign entries must sign an affidavit
- All athletes competing in Amateur classes must posses a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request (A902)
- Exception: Lead line riders who require only a NSEF or other PTSO membership
- Please be aware that NSHJA membership is required to participate and/or benefit in the NSHJA Programs.
- PLEASE BE AWARE, some classes only require Bronze EC Memberships, and some require Gold. See a) above.

2. EC Horse Recordings/EC National Passports/FEI Passports

- All Canadian entries are required to have an EC Horse Recording with a valid EC horse license to compete (A402), or if owned by a temporary sport license holder a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (A404)
- Exception: Lead line riders, and horses or ponies competing in <u>only</u> the hack division.
- Horse licences are required of all horses competing in Gold classes.
- Horse licences are NOT required for horses competing in Bronze classes, however, if a competitor wishes to compete in Gold classes they must purchase a temporary horse licence or a permit one.

3. Equestrian Canada and Discipline Fees

Equine Medication Control - Drug Testing and Fees:

- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.6) (A1008)
- The person responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse (A101). The person responsible may be the trainer or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The person responsible must be an adult and must have an EC individual or group license, with the exception of a Junior Exhibitor parent or guardian. (A214)
- All EC sanctioned competitions are required to collect a prescribed medication control fee for each horse entered. All fees collected are to be remitted using the EC Form to the EC Equine Medications Control Committee or its designate as per the Competition Administration Policy. This fee is to be identified on the entry form as a stand-alone item and not bundled or combined with other fees. (A1008)
- Bronze competitors remit \$3.50 per horse and Gold competitors remit \$7.00 per horse.



4. Entries:

- Entries must be received in hand by the closing date. Any entry not received by closing date will be considered Late Entry and subject to an additional \$40 Late Entry administration fee. Post Entry Fee: \$50.
- Entries will be accepted by email but will NOT be processed until e-transfer completed.
- Entries will be accepted through Horse Shows Online (May 21st-29th only).
- One horse per entry form.
- All entries must be completed on a Sambea entry form. All entries must be complete with proper signatures, complete address, membership and passport numbers. No phone or Facebook entries can be accepted.
- The Competition Management has the right to refuse or limit entries as circumstances warrant.
- No "hors concours" at this competition: Article A808.

5. Cancellations & Substitution of Entry:

- If cancellations are received in writing by 12pm (noon) on Thursday June 7, with a copy of a Doctor of Veterinary Certificate or Medical Doctor's Certificate, all fees will be refunded less the \$40 Administration Fee plus 15% HST. After this date there will be no refunds.
- Substitution of Entries: Will be at the discretion of the competition manager & competition secretary.

6. Adds/Scratches:

- At the discretion of the Competition Office.
- An add fee of \$10 per class and/or per division may apply to adds on the day of the class. Added entries may be required to go first in the order of go, if applicable.
- All scratches must be recorded in the competition office.
- Entries that have not scratched according to the above procedures is fully liable for all fees (See A816) and \$10 penalty applies.
- Horses competing in a class without being officially entered will pay the class fee
 and may be subject to a \$10 penalty.

7. Payment:

- All entry fees, medication fees, Jump Canada Levy and administration fees and stabling fees (if applicable) must be paid in full prior to the competition.
- \$40 Administration Fee will apply.
- \$5.00 Medic Fee will apply.
- Payment can be made by cash, cheque or electronic fund transfer



- Cheques are to be made payable to Sambea Farm. No post-dated cheques.
- Sambea Farm is a registered business, and as such must collect HST on any competition fees not passed on to a second party, i.e. Equestrian Canada (HST #803603935 RT0001)
- Sambea Entry Closing Date: Tuesday May 28, 2019

8. Returned Cheques:

- A \$50 charge will be assessed on all returned cheques.
- Unsettled accounts will be referred to EC, which will result in suspension from all EC competitions.
- Accounts left unpaid will not be permitted to compete at future Sambea National or Summer Horse competitions until paid in full.

9. Schedule:

- The Competition Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any class or division with insufficient entries. Any class/division with fewer than 5 entries may be combined or cancelled or run with no prize money offered.
- Orders of Go: Sign up orders of go will be offered. However, if competitors, trainers or support staff are not respectful of the time, competition management will create posted orders of go.
- Schedule times may result in an earlier start time based on the number of entries.
 - The tentative schedule will be published on the Sambea Farm Facebook page in advance of the first day of competition. Any changes to the schedule will be posted there as well.

10. Protective Headgear:

- See A905 and G102. At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear.
- Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM
 (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.);
 BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards; or AS/NZS
 (Australian/New Zealand Standards.
- Protective headgear must be properly fitted and securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.

11. Competition Numbers & Dress Code:

- Sambea issued competition numbers must be worn and visible at all time in the schooling and warm-up areas and in the competition ring (A814). Any horse wearing the incorrect number may be eliminated.
- Dress Code: Competition management may monitor ring attire. Refer to G109.



12. Office Hours:

• The competition office will open 60 minutes before the start of the competition day and will close 30 minutes after the last class of the day.

13. Stabling

- Limited stabling (20 stalls available on-site Wednesday-Sunday). First come basis.
- \$45 per day/night, HST applicable
- Bring your own bedding or reserve peat moss \$8/bale plus HST
- Stalls MUST be prepaid to secure reservation. Please use stable form.
- Several local barns in the arena may have stabling available.

14. Presentations:

- Jumper competitors must be mounted when entering the ring for presentations.
- Class Winners, Champions & Reserve Champions, and High Point Winners will have their photos taken in ring.

15. Schooling & Schooling Rules

- FEI Schooling rules will apply.
- For Jumper Divisions, no schooling rounds are offered. Horses may flat in the competition arena if time allows.

16. Pony Measurement

- Pony measurement will be required for any pony under the age of 8 years.
- Time and location will be posted in the office.
- Article A1104 Temporary Measurement Forms: Until a horse or pony is eight years
 of age, a temporary measurement form must be obtained annually.

17. General Information

- Trucks and trailers must be parked in designated parking areas.
- Fire lanes must remain clear. Vehicles may be towed at owner's expense.
- Car parking is 200m from Sambea competition grounds at the Lawrencetown Community Center. Competitor cars are encouraged to park there to allow room for horse trailers.
- Trailer entrance to Sambea is just past Conrad Road off the Hwy 207.
- A disaster plan is in place as per EC requirements.
- Bandwagon Café will be on site with food service.



18. Premiums & Payouts

 Prize money will be mailed to owners, within 10 business days following the competition after verification that all entry and applicable fees have been paid. However, every effort will be made to payout prize money at the end of the competition.

Prize money may be credited to accounts.

Note exception for 0.60M Jumper – Riders will RETURN for the Jump Off and will be given time to walk the J/O course.

- It is highly recommended that horses do not enter more than six classes a day (not including an invitation to a winning round).
- Optimum Time may be used in some divisions.
