Athlete/Horse Eligibility	-Athlete must be current NSEF member prior to earning points from a qualified competition -A horse must be entered in a competition using the same name and spelling throughout the Scotia Series. Failure to do so may impact qualifications for Provincial Championships Points are based on athlete/horse combination, with the exception of Showmanship class. Showmanship points may be earned using any horse throughout the series (max one horse per class).		
Provincial Championship Selection	-Each district shall be represented by the top two eligible athlete/horse combinations in each Division. Competitors will be notified that they are eligible in late September/early October.  -Districts are based on the athlete's address on NSEF record as of September 22 <sup>nd</sup> , 2019.  -There are six Districts in Nova Scotia as outlined in the picture above.  -Athletes can compete and earn points in any eligible Scotia Series competition within Nova Scotia.		
Provincial Medalists	-Athletes eligible for the Championships will compete in classes combined with open competitorsProvincial Championships Athlete standings will be determined based on the placing within the open classThe Championship competitor's placing will be converted to pointsThe Medal Standings will be based on the points from the Provincial Championships onlyThe Junior and Senior Showmanship Medals will be presented based on the Championship Competitor's standing in the Junior/Senior Showmanship ClassThe Junior and Senior English Flat Division Medals will be presented based on the Championship Competitor's standings in the Junior/Senior English Pleasure, Road Hack, and Equitation on the Flat classesThe Junior and Senior Western Performance Division Medals will be presented based on the Championship Competitor's top four point values from the following five classes: Western Pleasure, Trail, Horsemanship, Reining, and Ranch Pleasure.
